COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Emergency Nurses Association (ENA) Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course (ENPC) is an information filled, 16-hour course designed that presents core-level knowledge and psychomotor skills associated with the care of children from birth through adolescence. ENPC welcomes participants from all emergency settings, nurses working in other specialties, and other care providers in contact with pediatric patients. The ENPC 4th edition is taught using online learning, lectures, videos, group discussion and hands-on skill stations (i.e., management of the ill or injured pediatric patient and the pediatric clinical considerations) to encourage participants to integrate their psychomotor abilities into a patient situation in a risk-free setting. The ENPC has been designed by nurses for any nurse who provides pediatric care, to sharpen technical skills and to provide a foundation for future learning. The ENA recommends ENPC as the minimal required education for emergency pediatric nursing.

DAY ONE

Morning lectures will include: Dealing with Children, Initial Assessment, Triaging the Pediatric Patient, Respiratory Emergencies, Shock, Pediatric Trauma, and Children with Special Health Care Needs. The afternoon will focus on Psychomotor Skill Stations.

DAY TWO

Morning lectures will include: Rhythm Disturbances, Child Maltreatment, The Neonate, The Adolescent, Childhood Illness, Behavioral Emergencies, Crisis, and Disaster. Afternoon sessions will consist of written and practical evaluations.

COURSE SCHEDULE

Lectures will start each day promptly at 8:00 a.m. Each day will end at approximately 5:00 p.m. Lunch is on your own.

COURSE COMPLETION

To successfully complete the course, the participant must attend all sessions, must score 80% or better on the 50 item multiple choice test and successfully pass the skill stations. It is suggested that all participants read the complete ENPC Provider Course manual, 4th edition, that will be sent to participants prior to the course. There are four lectures (pain, environmental emergencies, toxicological emergencies, and stabilization and transport) that are presented in a webinar format, which the learner is expected to watch and complete before coming to the live class. Participants will be awarded CEs for these lectures after watching and completing them online, and they will also receive separate CEs for their attendance in the live course. A card verifying the successful completion of the ENPC Provider Course will be issued to the RN along with a certificate for 16.0 contact hours. Verification remains current for four years.
